Gilead: As it Was Through the Years

"Gilead", the northwestern section of Hebron, is the subject of the Hebron Historical Society's September 26th program. Gilead, the mainly agricultural portion of town, still retains much of its open space. Although the technology of farm tasks has evolved, it is still carried on in the open air.

Mary Ann Foote, whose relatives settled in Gilead in 1717, is the presenter. She has been the lucky recipient of learning lots of Gilead's history from long-lived relatives and others. From politics to religion to daily life and more, Foote will provide background on Gilead's beginnings and development.

Old Town Hall (26 Main Street), the home of the Historical Society, is the location for the September 26th program. The program is free and open to the public, although donations are always appreciated and utilized for the maintenance of the Society's buildings.
